




#### TRUST Trust in institutions

#### Government, political parties






### Would you describe yourself as being a member of a group that is discriminated against in this country?


#### Proportion of YP feeling discriminated




# Sexuality **Economic situation** Act Colour or race **Ethnic group Gender Religion**

## Social distance: proportion of adults (30 to 74) who definitely not like to have young people as neighbours







#### To sum up

- YP trust in political parties and government is rather low leads to low participation
- YP trust in police, courts and social welfare is rather high good ground for engagement
- Nearly third of YP feel discriminated (GB over 50%!)
- Many YP feel discriminated because of their age
