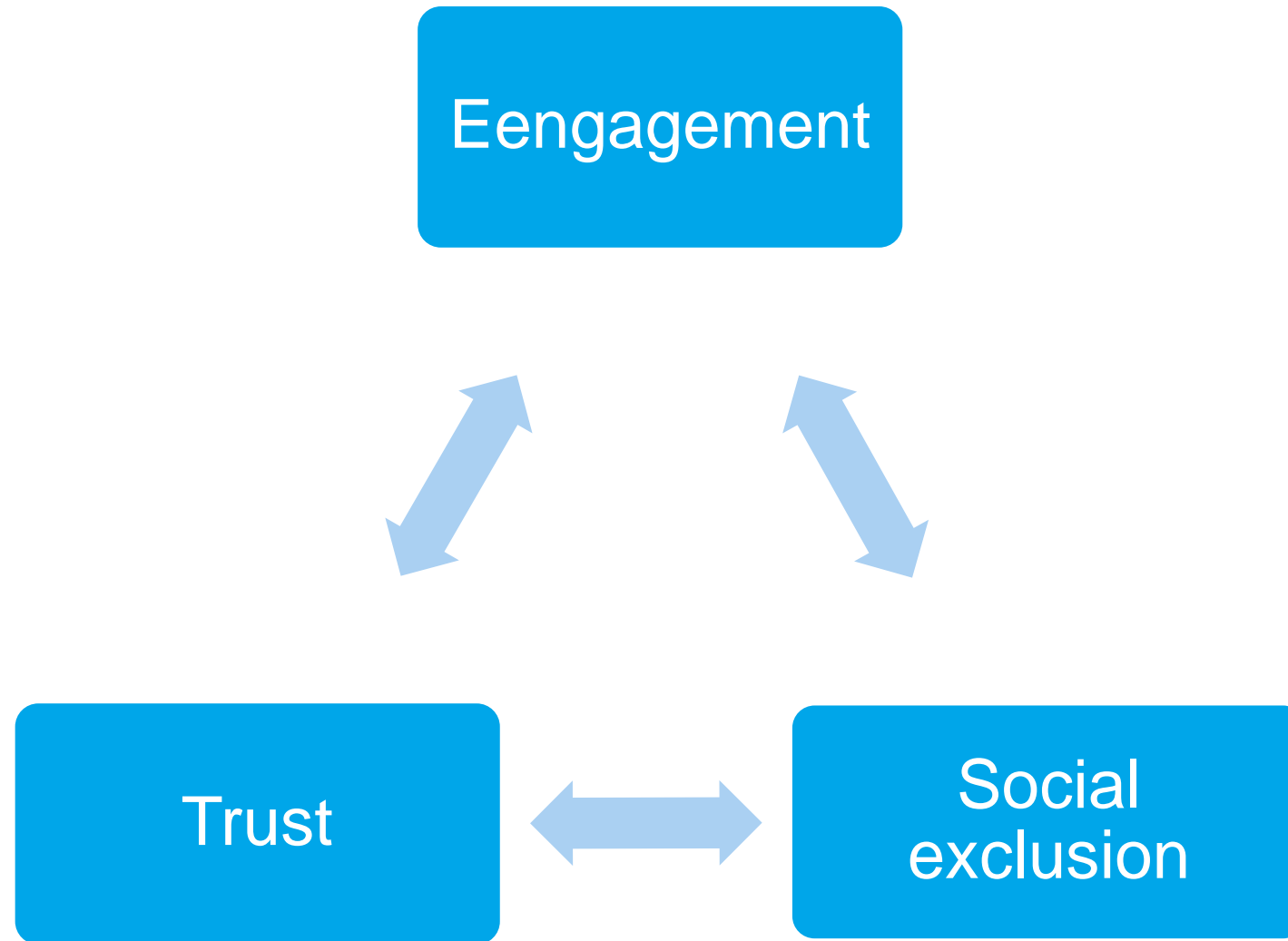

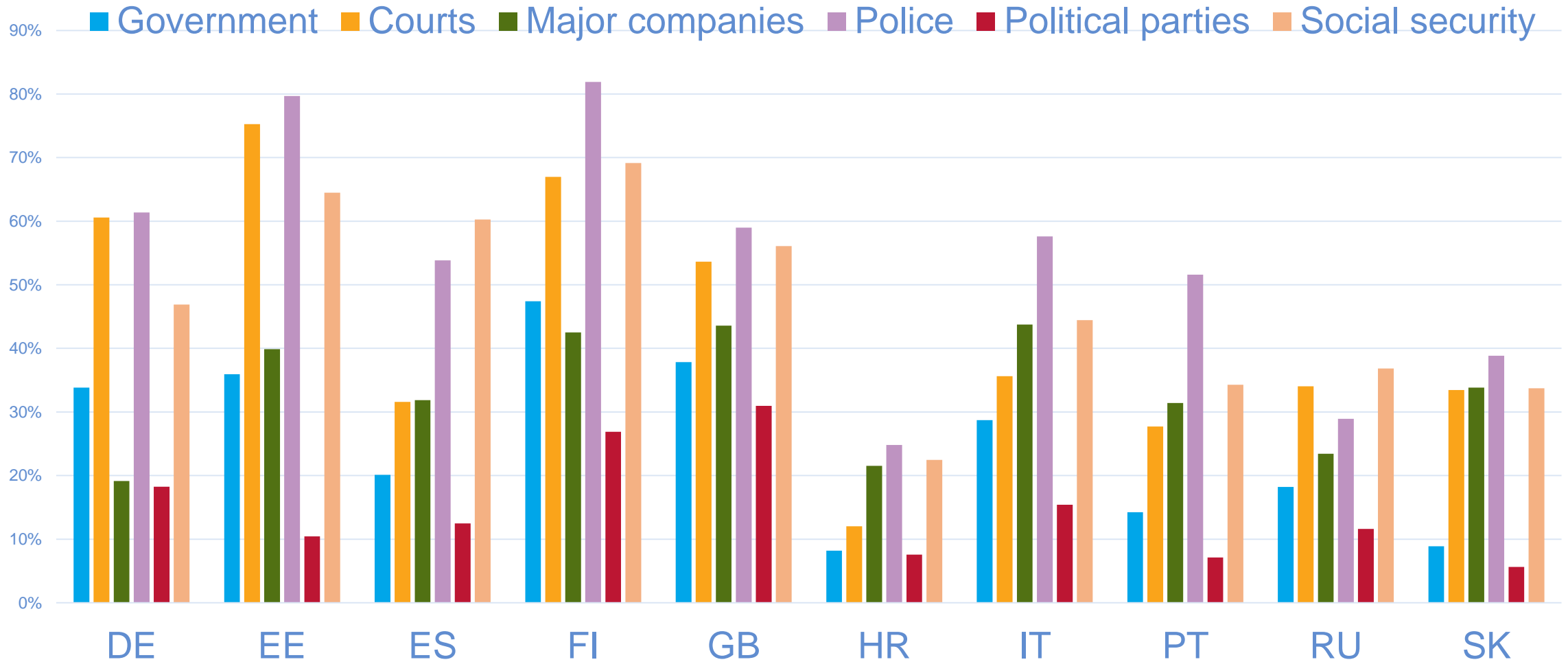

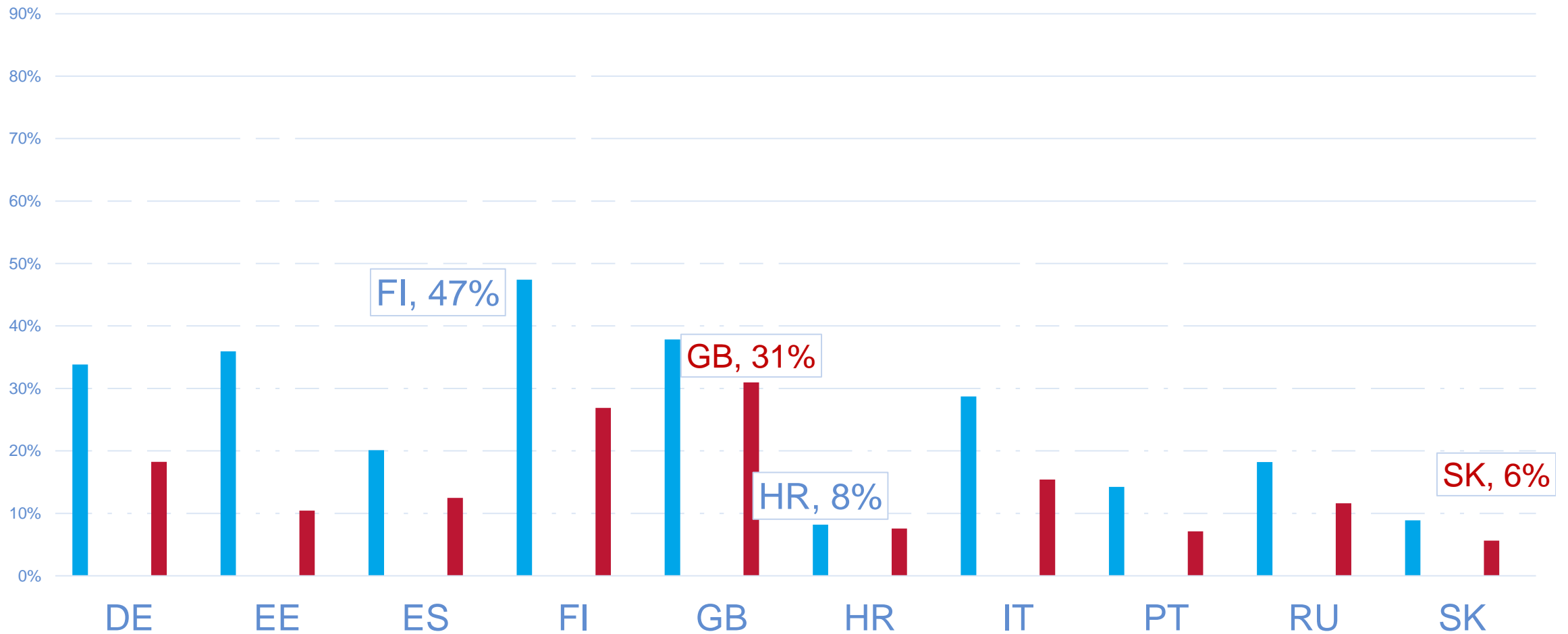
*Please mark, for each institution, how much confidence you have in them, is it a great deal, quite a lot, not very much or none at all?*



# Proportion of youth who have high confidence in



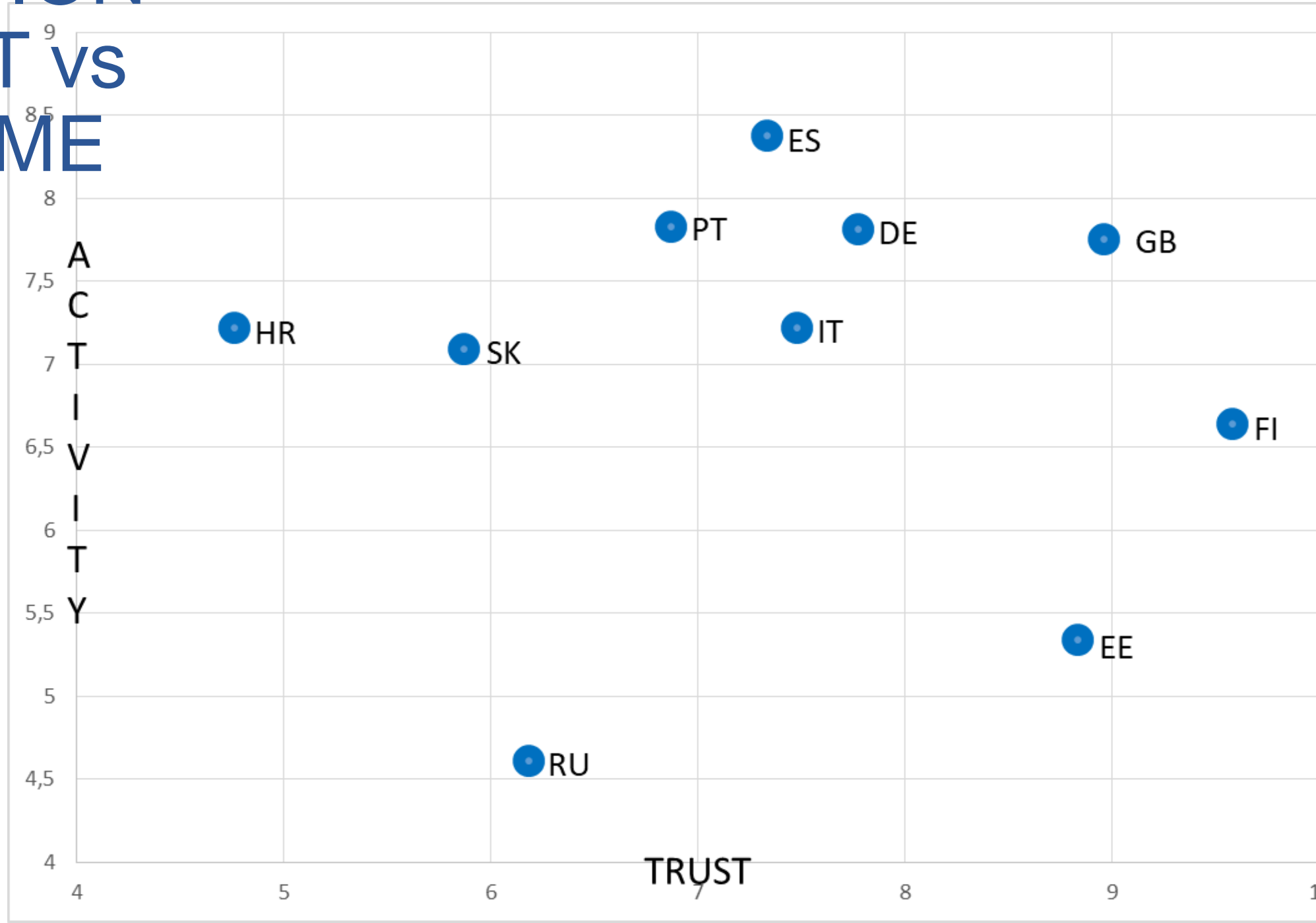

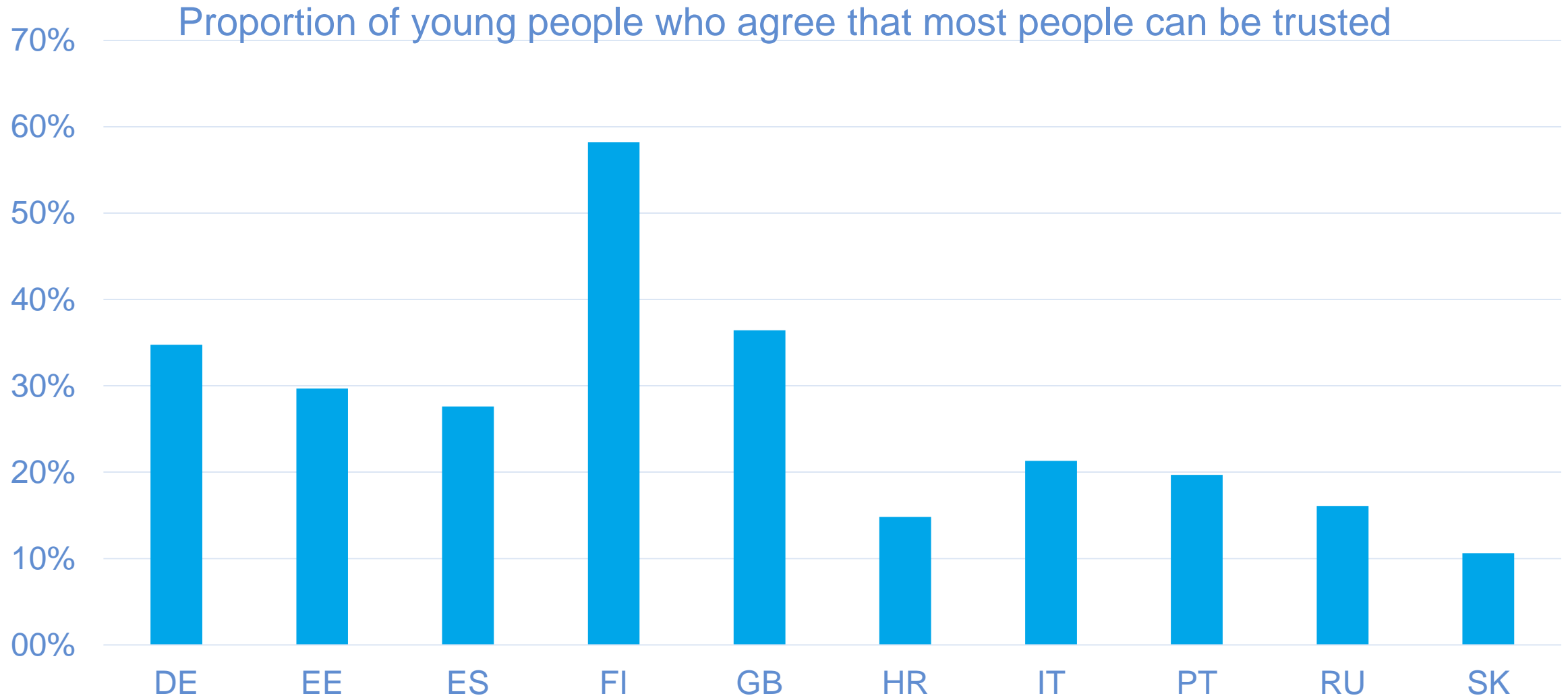

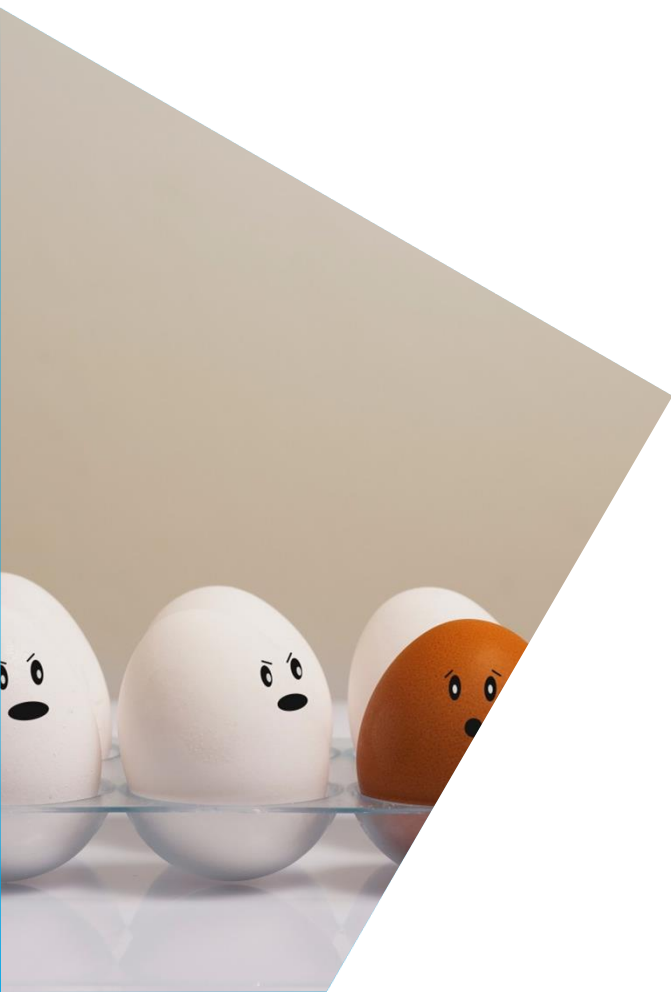

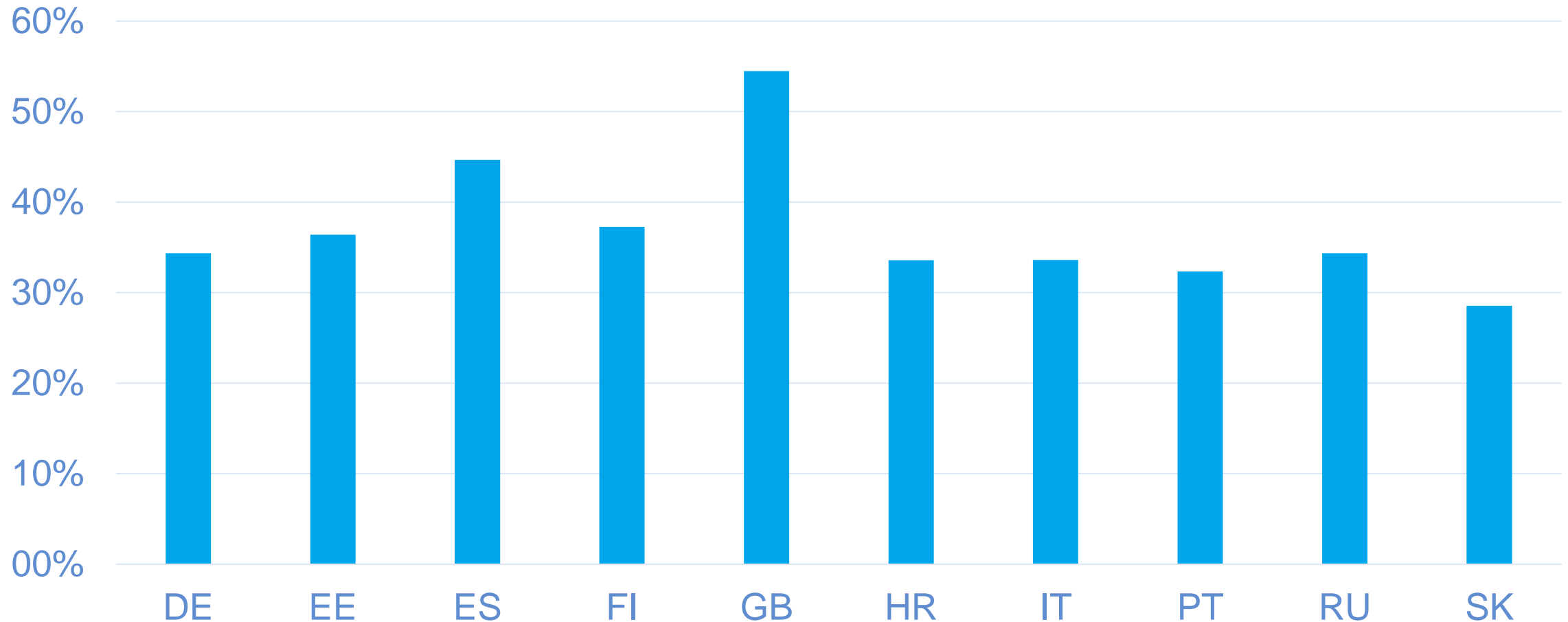


# Discrimination, stigmatization, and social exclusion

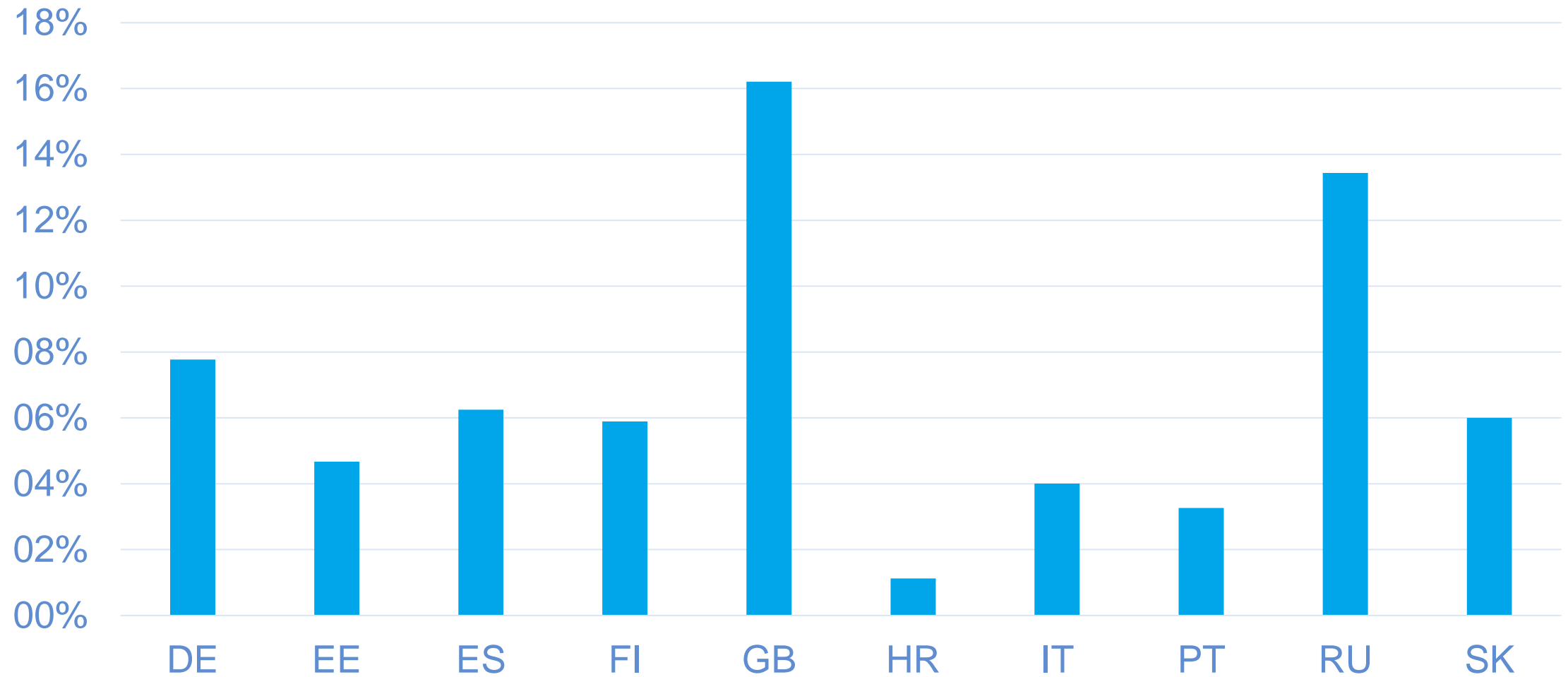

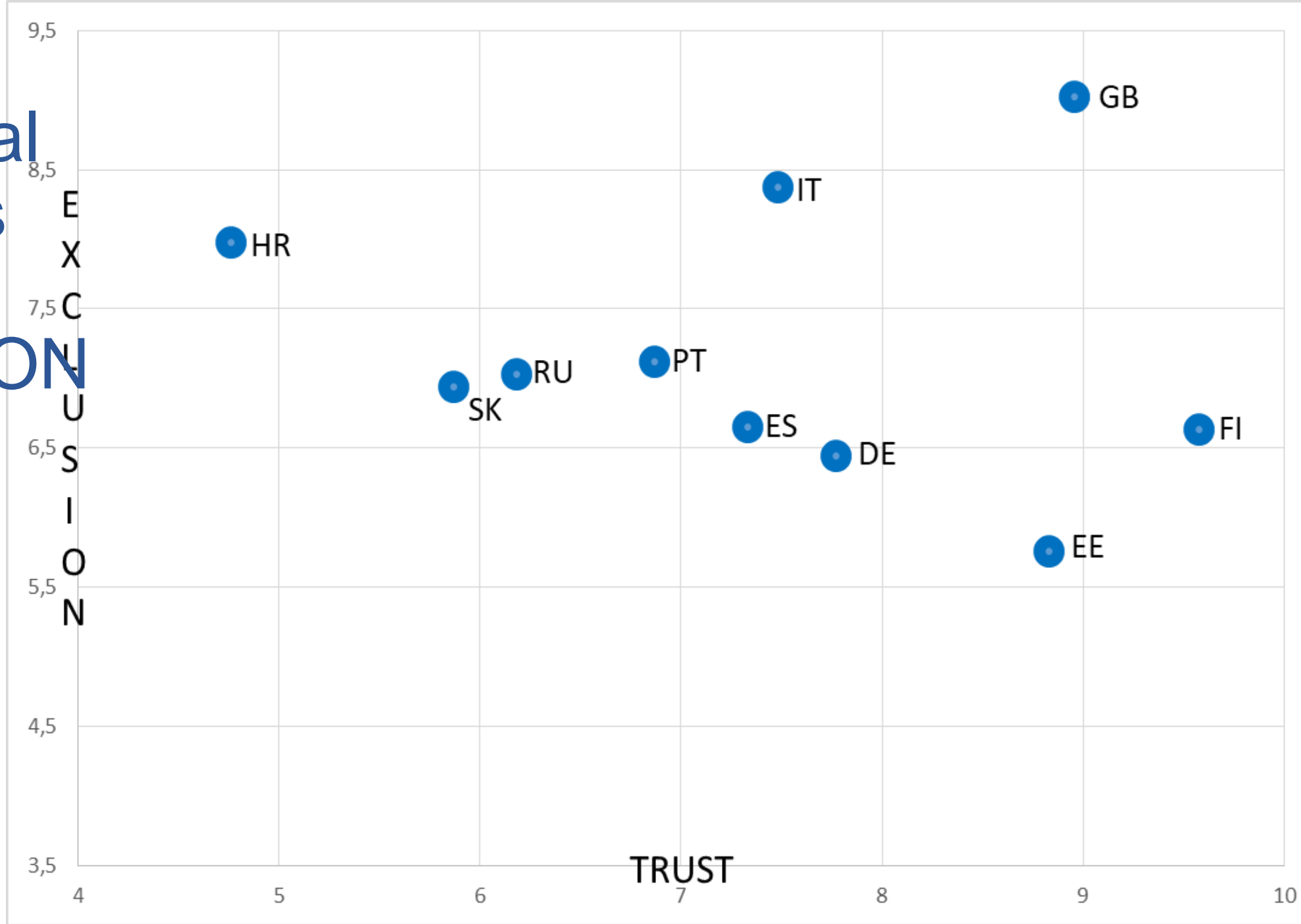

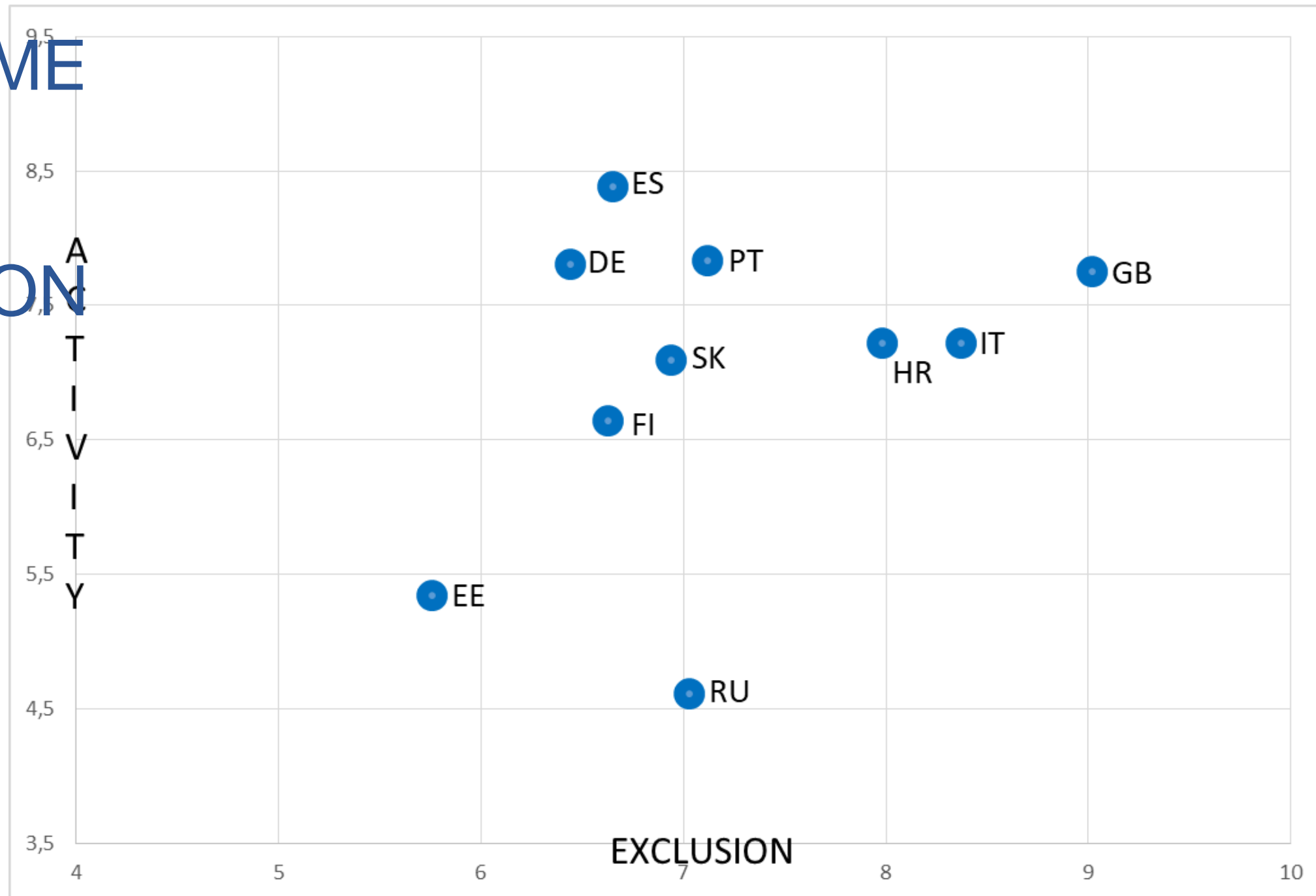
# Social distance: proportion of adults (30 to 74) who definitely not like to have young people as neighbours



# Institutional TRUST vs perceived EXCLUSION

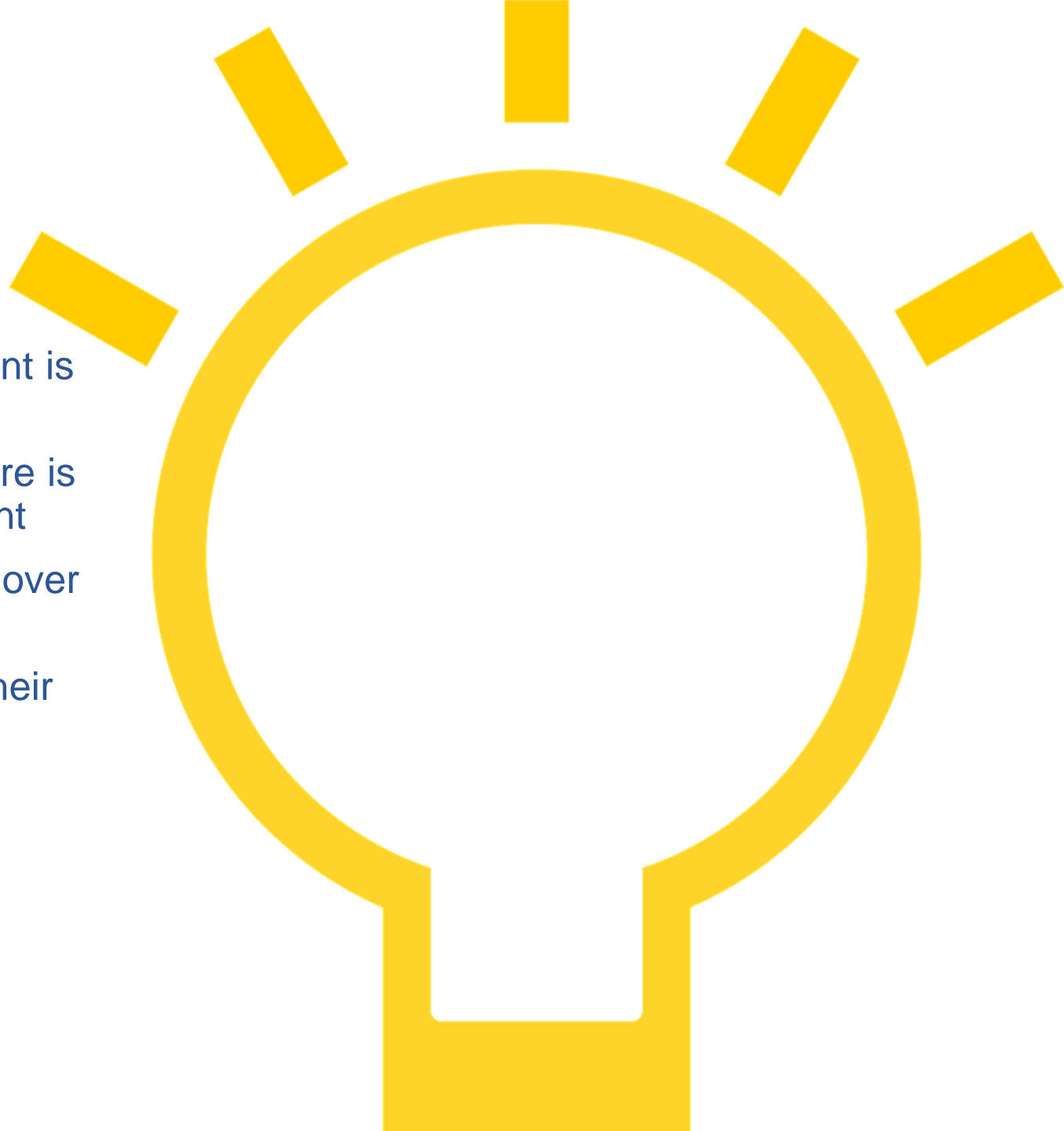


# ENGAGEMENT vs perceived EXCLUSION



# To sum up

- YP trust in political parties and government is rather low – leads to low participation
- YP trust in police, courts and social welfare is rather high – good ground for engagement
- Nearly third of YP feel discriminated (GB over 50%!)
- Many YP feel discriminated because of their age
